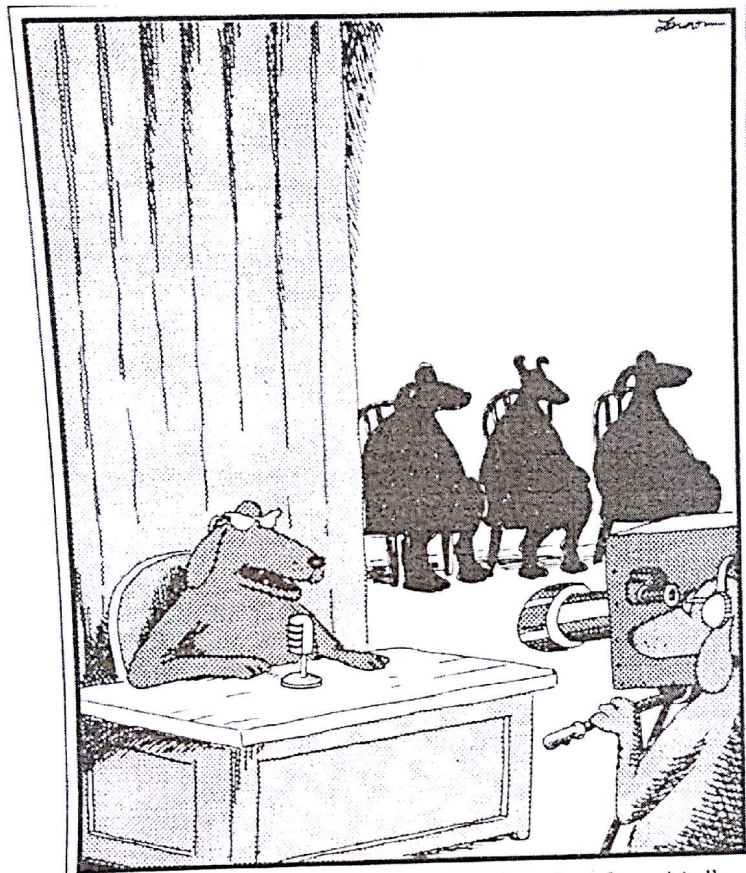

Social Studies

Students will move to lesson 4, "Local Celebrations" (pages 124-131) of Unit 3, "Many Cultures, One Country." We will learn that what people celebrate is important to them, discuss how some communities hold fairs to honor people, recognize that people around the world celebrate their freedom, and lastly identify how Native Americans honor their heritage. **Test will be on Thursday, February 2nd.**

Math

We have been working on applications of perimeter and area, and will be wrapping up that unit and moving on to our next unit in Trailblazers, which is entitled "Parts and Wholes". In this unit, students will work with fractions.

Science

This week, we will bring our focus from "mock rocks" to actual samples of minerals, and practice different tests that geologists might do to identify and recognize one mineral from another. A big focus of this unit is on scientific properties, or what makes something that exists in the natural world unique from other things.

Language Arts

This week most students will continue Lesson 12 of our *Storytown* curriculum.

The robust vocabulary words that students are studying in Lesson 12 are *deciphered, mistaken, translate, repairs, heaving, bothersome, din, dodging, catastrophe, fortunate*. The story we are reading for this lesson is *A Pen Pal For Max*, an example of realistic fiction. The lesson test will be this Thursday, February 2nd. The Language Arts homework this week is the reading log (20 minutes a night).

Since this is a short week, there will be no spelling sort or spelling test for this week.

Writing

This week in Writing Workshop students will finish publishing their information books. Once the books are published, students will have the opportunity to share their books with one another. Published books will be stored in our classroom library for a time, for students read and enjoy.

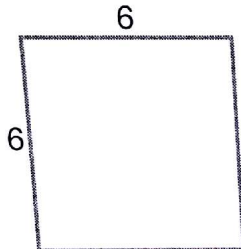

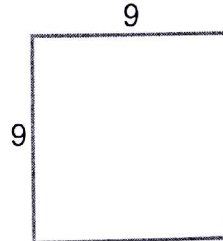

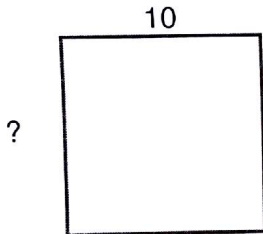
1 a. Find the perimeter of the square.



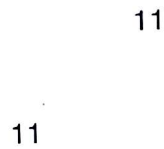
1 b. Find the area of the rectangle.



2 a. Find the missing side length, when the perimeter is 40.



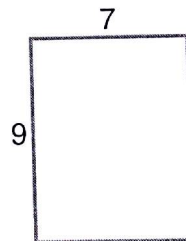

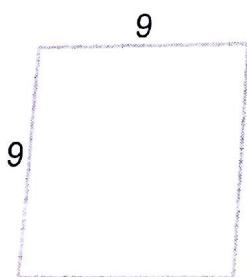
